### **FAQ document**

In 2021, the State Government committed \$5 million to renewal works in Withers through the Withers Regional Renewal Project.

Residents may have noticed some changes already underway within the community. Over the last 12 months, the Project group has been working towards the delivery of new housing, access roads and plan for public spaces.

#### Stakeholder workshops

# Withers connector roads

The first new road connection, Kookaburra Drive, officially opened in October 2022. This road connects Minninup Road and Jacaranda Crescent, reducing the travel distance between the two from 1.7km to just 90m!

As well as the road connectors. there will be increased pedestrian opportunities throughout Withers. This will include footpaths with lighting and CCTV. Increasing connection aims to increase the passive surveillance in the community, which decreases opportunities for anti-social behaviour.

Connector roads, refurbishments and pedestrian access are some of the physical aspects of this project. We want to hear how these changes impact your day to day life and use this as an opportunity to strengthen the Withers community through

## **City of Bunbury** Neighbourhood **Connect Grant Funding**

Neighbourhood events are a great way to connect residents with their community. It can build a sense of pride amongst the community and encourage residents to care for their neighbourhood and help improve safety.

The City of Bunbury offers a dedicated grant to help passionate individuals and groups to support residents in developing a sense of safety and connection, through community initiatives in their neighbourhood.

The Neighbourhood Connect category is open all year round and applicants can apply for up to \$5,000 under the following tiers:

#### Tier 1 up to \$1,000 No matched funding required

Tier 2 \$1,001 to \$5,000 No matched funding required

We are interested in funding initiatives that meet the Neighbourhood Connect category including those that:

- are within the City of Bunbury neighbourhoods
- encourage an aspect of neighbourhood safety
- allow residents to come together to connect and meet
- are delivered by the community for the community
- actively engage local residents to be involved in their neighbourhood.

# John Banks Memorial Dog Park Did you know?

Along Parade Road, just on the edge of Withers, the John Banks Memorial Dog Park comes alive with dogs and their owners. It's said that the afternoon, around 5pm, is the busiest time to play with other pups and chat to their owners, but the Dog Park can also be animated throughout the day.

A group of passionate residents have come together to advocate for upgrades to the John Banks Memorial Dog Park. This includes an additional area for smaller dogs, water fountains, improved gate access and the installation of a community noticeboard and CCTV. They've even had a purple bench built by the Men's Shed to be installed at the Park. This bench is part of an initiative that creates awareness about the impact of domestic and family violence and has been constructed to accommodate a wheelchair or pram in the middle of the two seats.

Did you know that the John Banks Memorial Dog Park is the only enclosed dog park south of Mandurah?

In November, a fundraiser event was hosted at Grand Cinema Bunbury with a premiere screening of Black Panther: Wakanda Forever. More than 50 community members attended the screening with 13 local businesses donating to the raffle. In total, the event raised more than \$1000 for the upgrades to the John Banks Memorial Dog Park!
