The right things to do at the Museum

Here are some of the things we need to do at the Museum to keep our visitors and our objects safe.



I will walk inside the Museum so that I do not fall over or bump into people or things.



I will not take food or drinks into the Museum so that nothing is spilled inside.



I will keep objects safe by not touching them unless there is a 'Please touch' sign.



I will keep my hands clean before and after I touch things. I can use the hand sanitiser by the front door or wash my hands in the toilets.

Where can I go if I need somewhere quiet?



The classroom is a quiet space where none of the displays make sounds. There are comfortable chairs in the classroom where I can sit and take a break if I need one.

Finding the Museum



The Museum is located on Arthur Street. It is outside of Centrepoint shopping centre. The front door is on the Arthur Street side. There are car parks next to the Museum.

Entering the Museum



The front door of the Museum is automatic. It will open as you walk toward it.

Entering the Museum

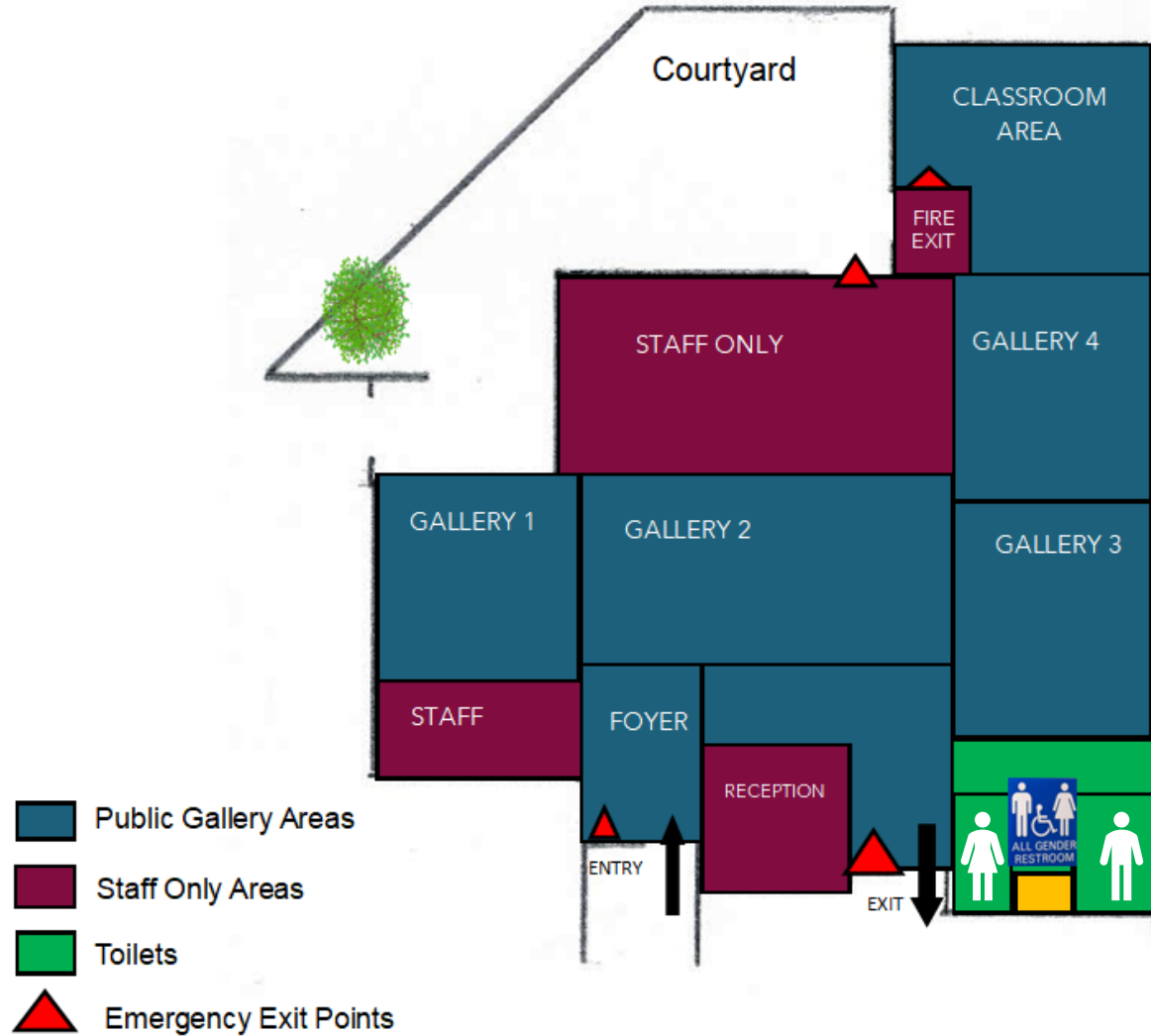


Lights on the floor show a welcome message when you walk inside.



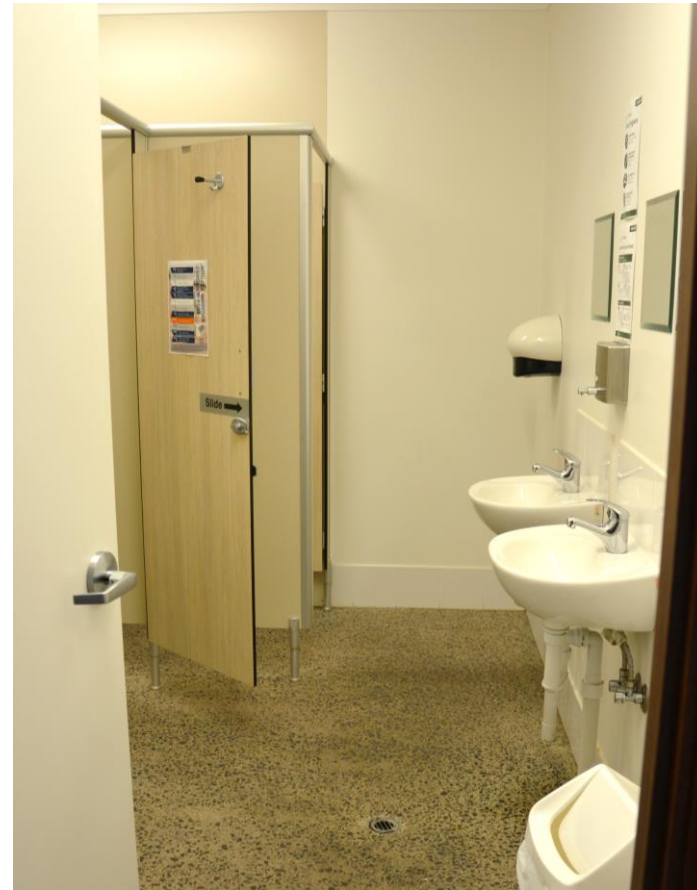
A friendly Museum team member will say hello when you walk through the door.

Toilets



The toilets are straight ahead as you walk in front of the front desk from the front door. If you are not sure where to find them, ask the person at the front desk.

Museum Shop



There is a shop in front of the counter. The shop sells books, souvenirs, and gifts made by local artists. Things in the shop can be bought at the front desk.

What to do in the Museum

While you are at the Museum, this is what you can do.



I can look at objects and pictures from the past.



I can read information about the history of Bunbury on panels around the Museum.



I can think about what I have learned and ask questions if I want to.



I can sit down and rest or complete an activity in the classroom.

Walking around the Museum



Most people turn left when they enter the museum and start with looking at the panels about Noongar history. Follow the panels around to find out about the history of Bunbury.

Walking around the Museum



Some of the displays in the museum stay the same for a long time. The gallery in front of the classroom changes often so that there are new things to look at.

Walking around the Museum



The Museum building used to be a school. The classroom has been set up to show what it might have looked like when the building was still a school.

There are activities you can do in the classroom. You might try writing on a chalkboard or copying fancy handwriting.

Leaving the Museum



The exit door is on the other side of the front desk. It is automatic and it will open when you walk toward it.
