


The Study


The City of Bunbury commissioned CATALYSE® to conduct an independent MARKYT® Community Scorecard.

Scorecard invitations were sent to 4,000 randomly selected households; 1,000 by mail and 3,000 by email. The City of Bunbury provided supporting promotions through its communication channels.

CATALYSE® sent email invitations to the City of Bunbury's customer contacts, and the City provided supporting promotions through various communication channels. The scorecard was open from 1 to 18 August 2023.








The scorecard was completed by 1026 community members with various connections to the City:

















Bunbury City Centre development/activation

Community driven actions

- Attract a variety of small businesses, shops, bars, restaurants and entertainment to fill vacant buildings and add vibrancy to the city centre. Suggestions include:
 - Advocate for landowners to improve their properties.
 - Advocate for more affordable rents.
 - Provide incentives such as rate subsidies.
- Improve streetscapes to make the city centre more appealing for businesses and customers.
 Suggestions include:
 - Tidy shop fronts and keep streets clean.
 - Introduce pedestrian malls and more al fresco dining.
 - o More green spaces and street art.
- Advocate for more apartment developments to grow the inner-city population.
- Provide better connections between the CBD, waterfront and other hubs.
- Provide more free parking.

Community Voices

"The town centre is dead. So sad for Bunbury. Attract business into the centre, perhaps with cheaper rents? I don't understand why everything moves out to Eaton."

"The City Centre needs to be reinvigorated. The number of empty shops is atrocious.

Cheaper rent/subsidies to local business, a closed off pedestrian mall &
festivals held within the city might bring people in."

"Assistance to local business to open up shops and stay there within the City Centre to help create a vibrant city culture."

"Keep the city parking free, or 3 hour limit is ok. Make it obvious for visitors."

"Clean up the city centre. Make it aesthetically inviting. Tidy up shop fronts.

Encourage development."

"Upgrade streetscapes, street furniture and planting. Support the retention and reuse of heritage buildings that provide so much CBD character. Bring the old Railway Station back to life."

"Dealing with vacant shops/landlords. Closing main street for markets and street dining, parades etc. Improved streetscaping etc. Continue with culture and street art (sculptures, murals), trees etc."

"Make part of Victoria Street a mall, closed to traffic. Businesses that are actually open in the city on the weekend. Connect the Band Shell to the waterfront better, redevelop it and make the estuary frontage more dynamic with eateries and other attractions."

"Focus on AFFORDABLE (not luxury apt) city living for professionals, singles/young couples: If they live in the city, they will spend more of their disposable income in the city centre too.

The new generation also cares about the environment so it's even better perks if they work in the city too as they can walk to work!"

"To make the city vibrant you need foot traffic. This can be achieved by encouraging apartments in the CBD ie less empty shops, more people who are looking to use the cafes and eateries."

"Bunbury is surrounded by water but has failed to capitalise on this and the railway station should be relocated back in the city centre."

"Greater interaction between areas. City centre is so disjointed, there is no active plan. Busselton has been able to connect foreshore with city centre, which makes it a more attractive destination. Bunbury needs plan to have CBD, beach, Koombana Bay, foreshore and 'lake' to become more intertwined - with local art, commercial hospitality activities and tourism."



Community safety and crime prevention

Community driven actions

- Provide more drug education and prevention programs.
- Provide accommodation and support services to reduce homeless sleepers in the CBD, the bus shelter, public toilets etc.
- Engage with at-risk youth by providing education and training opportunities, mentoring and activities.
- Advocate for a more visible police presence with more patrols and more engagement with the community, particularly at-risk youth.
- · Provide more ranger security patrols.
- Install more CCTV and lighting in streets, parks and public areas to deter criminal activity and make the streets safer to walk at night.

Community Voices

"Petty crime and drugs are a massive issue in Bunbury and needs a concentrated effort to stamp out."

"More drug use prevention programs. More CCTV in community areas/facilities. Security presence. More police interaction with locals/youths to help develop and promote positive attitudes to law enforcement"

"Drug education to all young people and what happens when you take drugs show them EXAMPLES and what happens afterwards NOT any good at all please get it through to them with EXAMPLES you have to be Stronger to [try] to stop this DRUG culture NOW before it's too late."

> "Target drug use, manufacture and dealers. Make Bunbury a difficult place for them to be active."

"Address homeless people in the Bunbury CBD and look at short term housing issues."

"More is needed to address the homelessness and crime rate. For a small town, police and community workers should be more present and an emphasis on giving whoever the criminals are deterrents to stop committing the crime. You should feel safe walking Bunbury streets at night and I don't believe people are."

"Improve sense of community and community safety. Youth education programs and working with community to reduce crime."

"Look at issues of youth crime, boredom, financial. Consequences for crime ie community service. Encourage taking part in sports. Mentoring. Employment."

""Extra police in suburbs. Interaction with Police / Community / kids. CCTV, security cameras."

"Liaise with local Police to start street patrols day and night especially around the Bus Terminal, Koombana, Youth Precinct. Maybe look at security companies hired for daily and nightly patrols for the feeling of safety wherever you want to venture."

"More CCTVs. Rangers more active in handling bad neighbor behaviour when it is safe to do so and doesn't need police presence."

"More street lighting in back streets. More surveillance cameras in public areas."

"Better street lighting. Get the drug dealers out of the CBD. More resources for the homeless, stop the begging and stealing."



Festivals, events, art and cultural activities

Community driven actions

- Provide a variety of events and festivals to encourage community connection and to develop Bunbury as a tourist destination. Suggestions include;
 - Family-friendly events such as street markets and concerts
 - o Adults-only events
 - Multicultural events
 - Music festivals
 - A trademark event that is unique to Bunbury
- Advocate for funding to attract more local and international touring acts to Bunbury.
- Invest more in promotion and advertising of events and festivals.
- Upgrade BRAG facilities (eg a café, gift shop)
- Advocate for the development of a purpose-built art gallery to house high-quality collections and exhibitions.

Community Voices

"Family friendly concerts/evenings, street markets in city centre with food, live bands"

"There is only a food festival for multicultural and nothing else. Considering we are multicultural there should be activities or groups that people can go to besides a food festival."

"Encourage more musical acts to come to Bunbury. A better variety of acts with different types of music. Larger markets. More events aimed at adults and not only families."

"Finding a unique area that Bunbury excels in and translating into festivals and events that will build Bunbury's identity."

"We need to find a "trademark" event that Bunbury can own......for example, the cows in Cowarumup, or Busselton's many events that it owns."

"Actually invest in bringing in larger artists to perform at BREC and in Bunbury. Try and jump on board of tour dates of artists so facilitate larger acts for the people as we only have small capacity venues and it's a positive thing for tourism and really setting Bunbury apart."

"There is not enough information of upcoming events advertised the Council is very poor in this area you seem to find out about it after the event."

"Notify in multiple media forms before events are on. I always seem to read about things after the event."

"More events to generate jobs and money for the city. More advertising for metro patrons to spend in our town."

"An exciting and dynamic gallery gift shop. A Cafe at the art gallery open every day.

More highly promoted city arts markets. Promoted throughout the state and
made successful through promotion as an art and craft destination."

"More support for the Bunbury Regional Gallery to secure tourism-worthy exhibitions. Funding for the City of Bunbury Collection to acquire relevant artworks by WA artists. A purpose-built A-class gallery to house the collection and to attract high quality exhibitions.

The area could attract tourists like the Guggenheim in Bilbao, for example."



Tourism and destination marketing

Community driven actions

- Allocate more resources (funding and staff) to promoting Bunbury as a tourism destination. Focus on unique experiences and Bunbury's location as the gateway to the southwest.
- Improve signage directing tourists into Bunbury and promoting local attractions.
- Provide a variety of accommodation options for tourists, ranging from free camping and better facilities for caravans to 5-star hotels.
- Develop Back Beach into a vibrant, connected foreshore precinct similar to Scarborough, Mandurah, and Busselton.

Community Voices

"We need a tourism officer."

"Bunbury is such a pretty place yet while visiting overseas or interstate no one knows of Bunbury & when asked where it is & you answer near Busselton or Margaret River, they all seem to know where they are, so more advertising is needed."

"We need to utilise our connection to the southwest of W.A. Busselton is absolutely murdering Bunbury in tourism and destination management. With the bypass if Bunbury doesn't work on it Busselton will become "The Gateway to the Southwest Experience." For the love of god utilise the gems we have – "Just 30 minutes north of the Busselton", use "Southwest" in everything that you advertise."

"Actually market the city to tourists - there is so much to do here, but council does not effectively market our assets. We have just as much to offer as Busselton, yet we are getting left behind."

"STOP advertising cafes... start advertising Bunbury experiences.. hang gliding back beach.. great beaches... amazing fishing.. wineries... the gin distillery...the back beach blow hole... the dolphins.. all the experiences that Busselton, Margaret River etc promote within their shires!!!

"Signage to direct people into Bunbury. Signage or a tourism board with a map showing the new play areas, restaurants, shopping etc to direct people into the town."

"Improvement in selling the city as a tourism spot needs clear and obvious signing for the dolphin centre, city centre and beaches"

"If Bunbury is trying to encourage tourists with caravan parking along Ocean Dve, you really should install a dump point and water supply for caravan travellers."

"Priority... More 4+ star accom and a 5 star!"

"We need to be more like Mandurah and Busselton with their foreshore. We have amazing waterfront destinations that are terrible. We could have a foreshore like Mandurah. Our back beach is wasted. People skip through here to go to Mandurah or Busselton."

"Develop the back beach with cafes and retail and hotels. It's a prime opportunity to attract people and businesses and you've done nothing with it forever."



Access to health and community services

Community driven actions

- Lobby the state government for funding to provide more health care services throughout the City.
 Specific mentions included GPs (particularly bulkbilling), specialists, nurses, OTs, paediatritions, dentists and after-hours clinics offering a range of non-emergency services.
- Advocate for further upgrades and expansion of the Bunbury Hospital to support the growing population

 more staff and beds, more equipment, a bigger emergency department.
- Improve accessibility to the hospital with more parking and patient transport services.
- Provide more mental health, homelessness support and drug rehabilitation services throughout the City.

Community Voices

"To lobby State and Federal governments for increased funding to attract more psychiatrists, paediatricians, GPs, specialists especially including pain specialists."

"More doctors and bulk billing . A better or 24-hour service for non-emergency medical issues, take some pressure off the emergency department at the hospital . For example maybe an area you can go to in the hospital separate to emergency department. More mental health services that are affordable. Waiting lists to see a psychiatrist is horrendous and expensive."

"Public specialty appointments are so scarce to non-existent.

Eg OT, Speech therapy, paediatrician, child psychologist. The private services are overwhelmed with waiting lists of months to years for vital services.

Increased services will provide urgent care preventing long term problems"

"Clinics for common requirements like Vaccinations, Blood Checks, Heart Checks, Age Well Facilities."

"Upgraded hospital facilities. I have had to visit the Emergency Department with my toddler and the facilities are old, dated and need improvement. An after-hours doctor and doctors who bulk bill would alleviate pressure on the hospital as well"

"Addressing the Bunbury public hospital emergency department wait times, bed availability and availability of specialists so we don't have to travel to Perth for all of the above and more."

"Lobby to state and federal governments to increase nurse to patient ratios in hospital. Safety for staff. Easier transport for clients/patients. Better awareness of services. Update some facilities."

"Need to build another hospital waiting time in ED is crazy the car park which was upgraded is still overflowing and can't get parking during the day."

"Free transport for health card holders to medical appointments."

"Homelessness is on the rise, let's take care of those less able too.

Community housing and mental health facilities."

"Better facilities for mental health. Better facilities for the drug epidemic Better facilities and programs to tackle the increased homelessness around Bunbury. Better programs/facilities to help curve the current youth crisis (crime, mental health, family problems)."



Seniors' services, facilities and care

Community driven actions

- Lobby for a wide range of accommodation and care options for seniors including affordable housing, lifestyle villages and high care facilities.
- Provide more home care services to support seniors living independently at home.
- Improve senior access to services and activities with improved footpaths, seating, more disabled parking and community transport services.
- Provide more spaces for seniors to meet with a range of activities to encourage socialising and healthy living.
- Advertise the range of services and activities available for seniors more widely – do not rely solely on electronic communications.

Community Voices

"Provide or facilitate suitable affordable accommodation for elderly."

"More Retirement Villages that compare with those offered by Busselton."

"Monitoring the growth of the Senior's demographic, basing a needs analysis on same and negotiating / lobbying with government and providers to have appropriate facilities in place in a timely manner."

"The aging population will require more care. Home care, followed by residential care. Residential care is severely limited and the hospital is clogged with high level care seniors with no appropriate place to go. Increase residential high care facilities."

"Better options for aged care support, particularly for those in home care."

"The most important for me is to allow elderly people to live the last years of their life in their own homes, instead of strange surrounding. More home care visits, elderly people would be much happier living in the comfort of their own homes."

"More Acrod parking. There are very few in the city without having to walk quite a distance which is impossible for most Acrod parking holders."

"Free transport for those unable to drive, free gardening services and cleaning services for those elderly living in their own homes."

"Make Bunbury accessible for elderly wheelchair or walker users. Walk the main street and see all the bumps in the footpaths and steps as you go into shops. The bumps are so uncomfortable for a person in a chair and getting the wheelchair into shops can be almost impossible."

"Providing inclusive, accessible, affordable programs to enhance the lives of aging community"

"Keep funding and supporting the senior citizen centre opposite post office.

The population is aging and places like this are very important to us."

"Facility as a meeting place with adequate parking. The senior citizens [centre] near the main post office has like 7 car bays and the ones adjacent to the post office are marked as 15mins only. Also to make it cheap to attend, these people have paid taxes and rates all their life, if annual fees are too high they just can't afford it"

"How about a directory of what is available for seniors including leisure activities."

"Better access to aged care facilities (not necessarily aged care homes) and providing information on what services are available and not relying on the internet and my gov stuff."



Streetscapes, trees and verges

Community driven actions

- Beautify Bunbury's streetscape and create a tree canopy for shade and to support biodiversity by planting more native trees and plants on verges, median strips and in public spaces.
- Provide a more attractive entry to Bunbury and keep the streets clean and tidy to improve street appeal.
- Keep trees watered, pruned and well maintained and remove any dead trees.
- Keep verges mowed, neat and well maintained and support the planting of native/edible verges.
- Review landscaping along Ocean Drive and Back Beach – consider planting native ground cover, shrubs and trees instead of grass.

Community Voices

"More trees being planted on verges to create more shade and enhance the street views."

"Bunbury has a very harsh feel about it now. With higher density housing many of the taller trees that added the greenery have gone. Not only does the area need trees replaced but also the softer undergrowth and plantings rather than so much concrete. For example, put plants back in road islands, trees in all of the city centre like in the coffee strip, mass plantings around old railway station/Bricknel Shell area

"I would like the City to plant more trees in streets in my suburb (Vittoria Heights). Trees reduce the ambient temperature up to 4/5 degrees in summer, provide shelter from rain in winter when caught short walking the dog etc. They make the suburb look green and leafy and enhance the ambience of the street. They also provide shelter to birds and other wildlife."

"All major roads into & out of our city have roundabouts. The plants are very poorly maintained or incorrect plants for locations. As we have a moderate climate and a good water supply, we could certainly make a good impression to visitors."

"Regular cleaning up main street from rubbish and leaves in the CBD."

"Bunbury's streetscapes are an eyesore. There is no uniformity/consistency and no evidence of strong design. Trees are immature and not maintained. Verges are, on the whole, unkempt. Take a leaf out of Busselton's book - they know how to do a good streetscape, reserve, park."

"Maintenance to existing trees in the suburbs, regular pruning, trees are too big and residents are constantly cleaning up council assets mess at the homeowners expense."

"Driving through East Bunbury particularly King Road and Herbert Road the state of the council verges is appalling. Clean up all council land and have regular maintenance carried out throughout Bunbury not just in the CBD."

"To be able to plant gardens on the verge maybe natives"


